Dear 10th Mountain Division Descendants and Friends,

I am happy to report that our organization is in a good place. By that I mean that we are on solid financial footing, we’re seeing our membership growing, and we’ve reinvigorated our good works efforts. Given my short tenure as President, I’m not going to take credit for this state of affairs. We are here because of the hard work of the previous Board. I have been lucky to inherit the responsibility to build upon the work that they did.

In my first quarter as President, I had the pleasure of attending the 50th Annual 10th Mountain Ski-in hosted by the Rocky Mountain Chapter. The Rocky Mountain Chapter did their usual outstanding job of organizing this event, and the weather gods generally blessed us. The ski day at Copper Mountain turned into a scramble to make it over the summit back to Leadville during a blizzard, but the resulting snow from that storm made for a memorable ski day at Ski Cooper the following day.
